## Driving Directions

From I-15 take the 9000 South/UT-209 exit #295  
Head west on 9000 S  
Turn south on Sandy Parkway  
Turn east on 9120 South  
Turn south on 300 West  
The Larry H. Miller Campus is located at 9750 S 300 W

**OR** Take the 10600 S. exit.  
Head East on 10600 South  
Turn North (left) on State Street  
Turn West (left) on 10000 South  
Cross under freeway and turn north on 300 West.
